



Declaration on Conflict Minerals

In 2010, the US Congress has passed a law that is intended to help reduce the violent conflicts in the Democratic Republic of Congo and bordering countries with the "Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, Section 1502" ("Dodd-Frank Act"). According to section 1502 of this Act, companies must disclose how the products they produce contain conflict minerals such as tin, tantalum, tungsten and gold.

We are getting more and more requests for the use of these conflict minerals. Meinberg Funkuhren GmbH & Co. KG does not undertake direct imports of conflict minerals or process them with us. We are very concerned about this issue and are committed to our social responsibility with regard to health, safety, environmental protection and human rights.

We would like to inform our customers that we use exclusively electronic parts and components from well-known manufacturers and distributors with whom we already have long-standing business relationships. We are committed to our parts and component suppliers for traceability and transparency, as well as compliance with the requirements of ISO 9001, and require the submission of corresponding documents with the information on material characteristics and origin. These data are archived and updated regularly and can be made available upon request.
